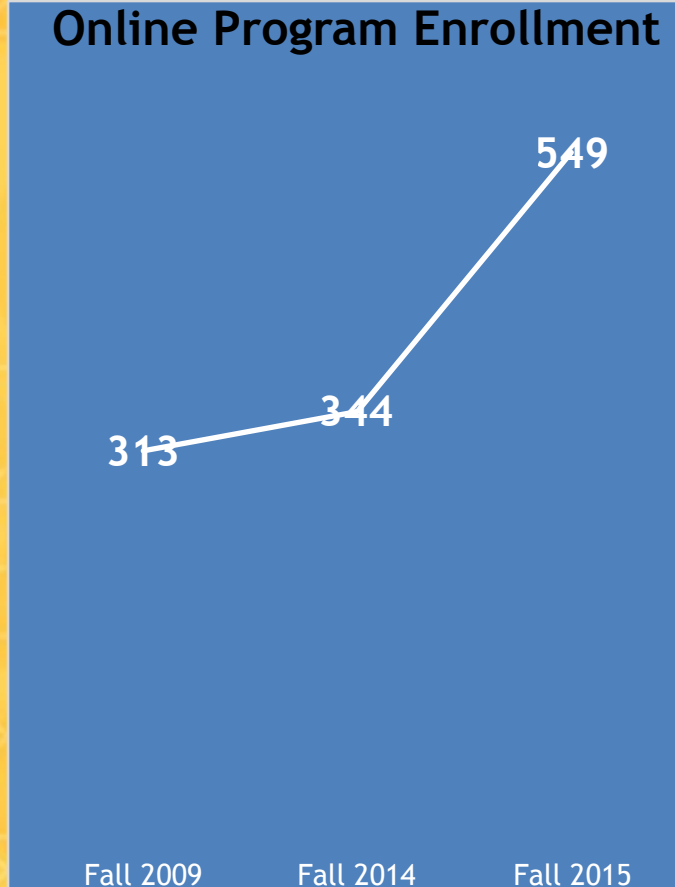

Oregon Tech Online (OTO) Overview

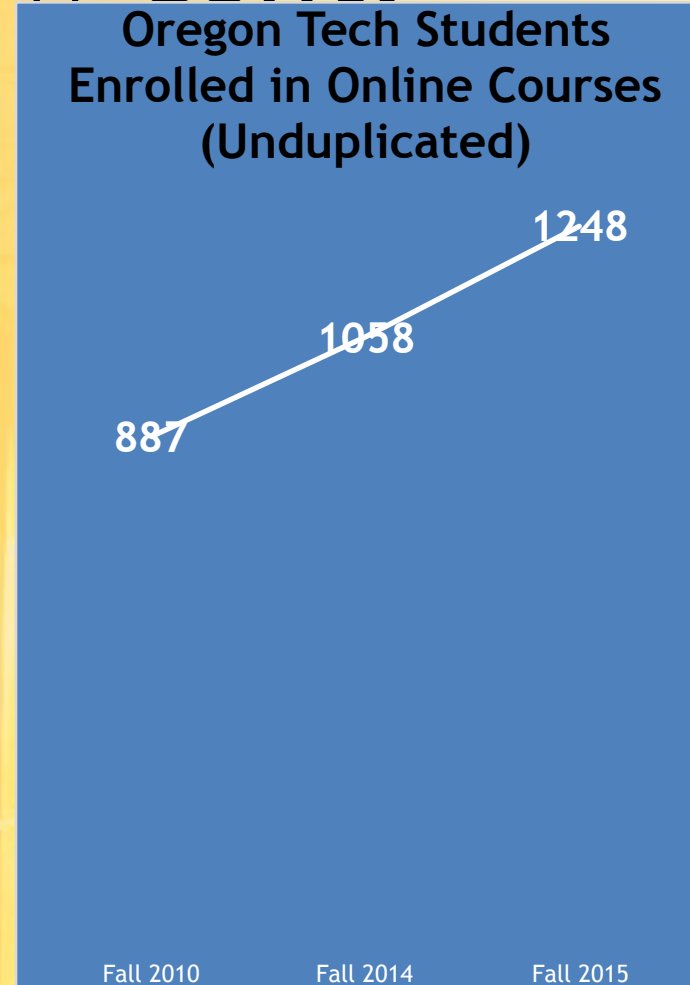
- **97 Faculty teach online**
 - 28 adjuncts
 - 8 former full-time faculty
 - 61 current full-time faculty
- **OTO Staff**
 - 2 dedicated to faculty support
 - 3 dedicated to student support
 - Shared ITS position
 - Several student workers

Online Program Enrollment

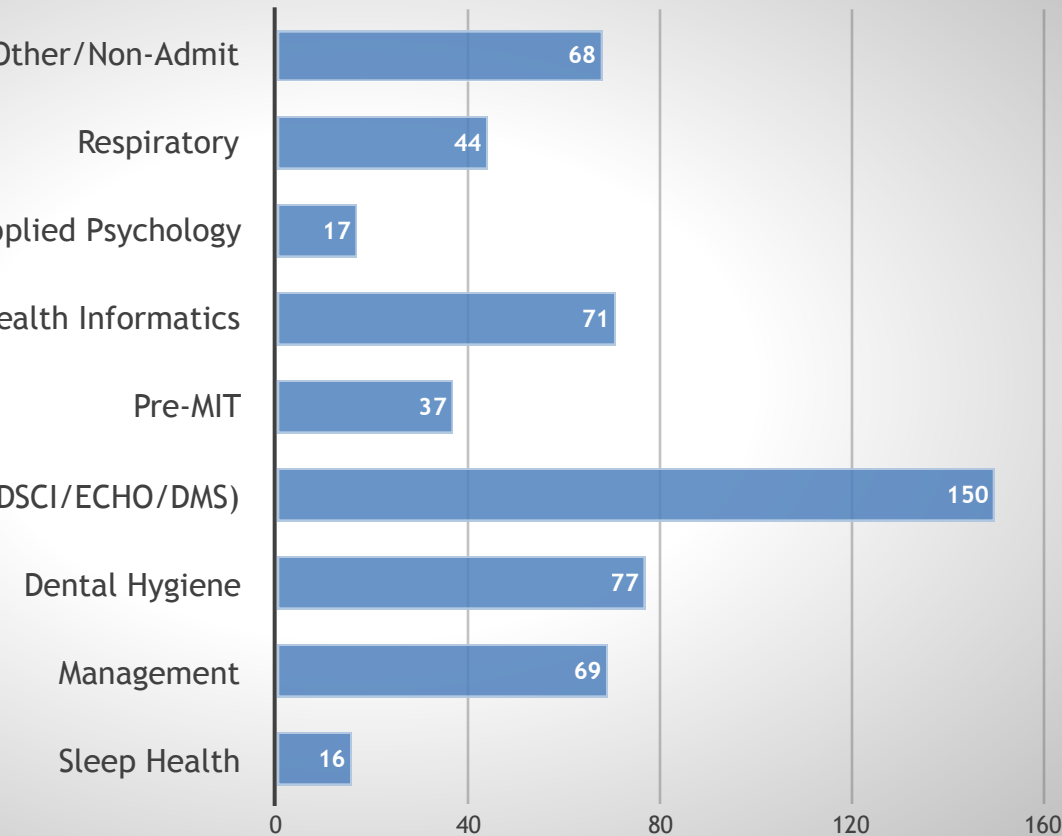


Oregon Tech Students Enrolled in Online Courses (Unduplicated)



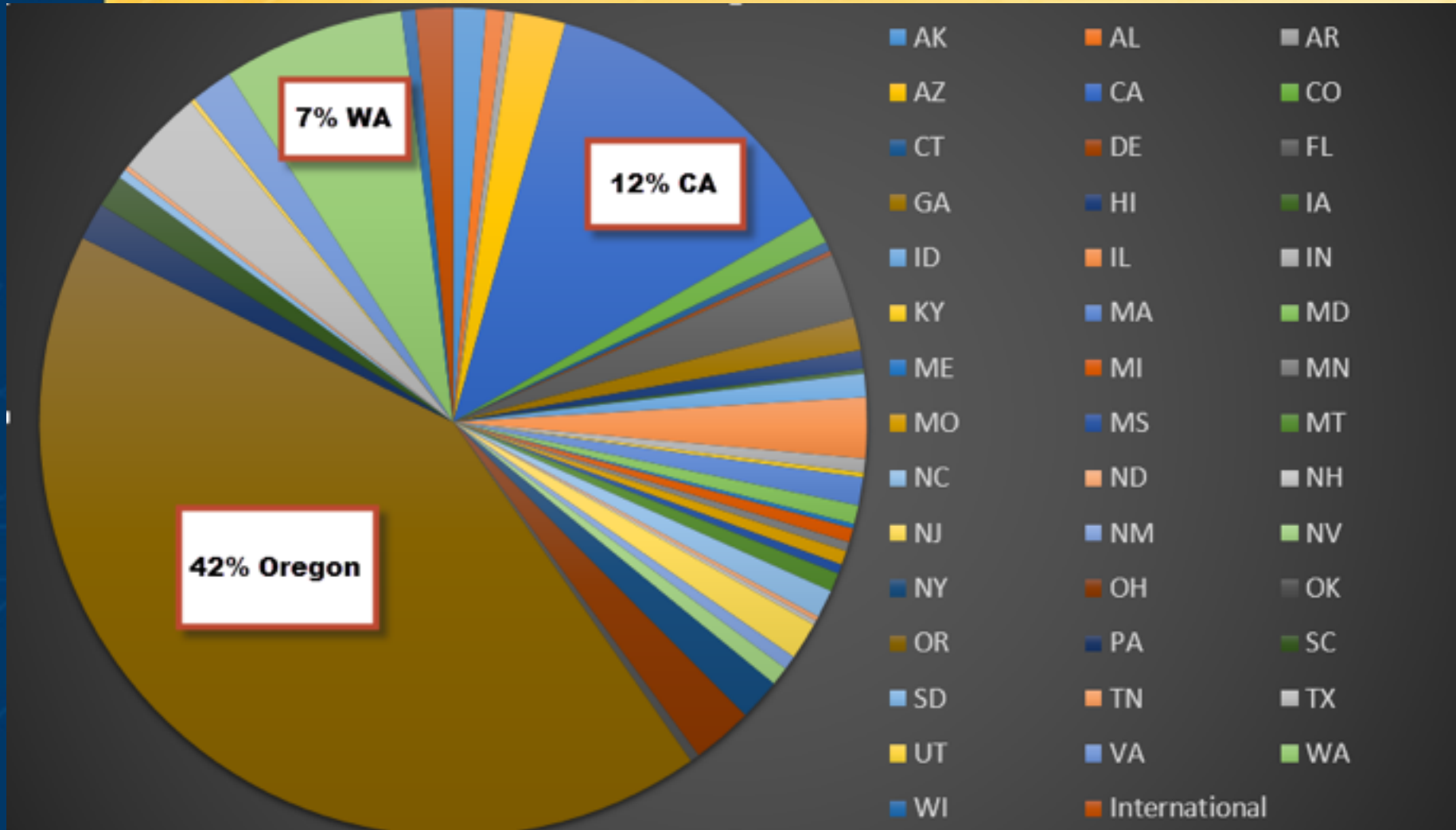
Oregon Tech Online Students

- 80% of online students at Oregon Tech find us online
- Most online students take between 6-9 credits a term

Breakdown by Location



The Online student

- Different goals—not usually starting a degree
- Different approaches to earning their degree—slow and steady wins the race
- Enter their program at vastly different points
- Average age of 32—a bit older than our on-campus students
- 66% female—compared to mostly male in Wilsonville and a bit less-than-half in Klamath
