

ASOIT Report to Board of Trustees

The Associated Students of Oregon Institute of Technology, or ASOIT is the student government branch that has previously acted by and through the authority delegated by the Oregon State Board of Higher Education, and would like to request the support from the Oregon Tech Board to continue to act in this role. ASOIT is dedicated to supplementing the social, cultural, physical, and educational interests of its members, and to represent the individual and collective interests of the students at Oregon Tech.

Previously, ASOIT has hosted the president at the Klamath Falls campus. With the advent of the Wilsonville campus, the lead ASOIT officer position on campus has been the vice-president. However, as of July 1, 2015, there will now be a president at each the Klamath Falls and Wilsonville campuses. Since the Wilsonville campus was established in 2012, the vice-president of ASOIT in Wilsonville has taken on an increased level of responsibility and reached the same level of duties as the president in Klamath Falls. This restructuring recognizes the increase in job responsibilities for Wilsonville officers, establishes a manageable work load for ASOIT leaders at both campuses, and will increase the communication between the campuses. The addition of the president position will help to establish more credibility with internal and external partners for ASOITW and the student in the president role.

An ASOIT Council will be formed and include the president, vice-president, and advisors at each campus. This group will meet monthly to discuss university-wide issues and coordinate collaboration between campuses. These changes will help us to better serve both student populations and make a more unified Student Government at Oregon Tech.

Thus far, ASOIT Wilsonville accomplishments have included:
