



How to Apply for ACES Services using Accessibility Information Management (AIM)

ACES Website

ACES is proud to provide Accessibility Information Management (AIM) software to assist with student accommodations. AIM is an online tool that allows students to register with ACES, apply for accommodations, and request accommodations each term. Accommodations include academic, housing, and service animals.

To start an application in AIM, follow these instructions:

ALTERNATIVE TESTING AGREEMENT DESCRIPTION

Type: ACES AIM Testing Agreement

Hello and welcome to ACES AIM Testing

ACES offices are linked to one online database system allowing for consistency, ease of access, and increased collaboration across the university. AIM also executes the same federally mandated ADA/504/508 processes and accommodation notices to all instructors and students regardless of campus location.

The following is a testing agreement designed to cover all tests, quizzes, pop-quizzes, mid-terms, and final exams for your course.

You will receive, via the Faculty Notification Letter (FNL), a request for a testing agreement. There is a link on the bottom of the FNL that will direct you to the testing agreement. Only one testing agreement is required per course.

FACULTY / STAFF INSTRUCTION

Please complete this testing agreement, indicating testing parameters that pertain to your testing policies and allowed materials which are different for each ACES student's mandated ADA accommodations.

If you wish to make modifications to this agreement following its submission, please login to AIM.

Please be specific as to the amount of time you allow ALL students for each test type. Do not add additional testing time. AIM will apply extra time or specialized accommodations accordingly. Unlimited testing time is not allowed.

Once your testing agreement is complete, students can then schedule their tests through AIM. Once a test is scheduled, you will automatically receive an email with a link to upload your test. Drop off services are still available if you are unable to upload your test. Contact your local ACES office for drop off options.

Students are required to schedule their tests 5 days in advance. Please keep students well informed of upcoming tests, quizzes, pop guizzes, and exams.
