The Vascular Technology (VT) program is programmatically accredited through the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP), upon review of the Joint Review Committee on Education in Diagnostic Medical Sonography (JRC-DMS). Feedback from industry affiliates confirms the VT program not only meets the bar established by CAAHEP, but also produces graduates ready to work in any hospital or clinical lab setting with minimal orientation or instruction.
